

YORK MUNICIPAL COURT RULES

Dignity, respect, and decorum is essential to a proper courtroom atmosphere. The following requirements pertain to all parties entering the courtroom.

- No weapons are allowed in the courthouse.
- No Cameras, No Recorders, No Cell Phones, and No Video Recording Equipment
- No electronic devices of any type except those used by the courts and its officers.
- No talking while court is in session.
- Inappropriate gestures or remarks at any time will not be tolerated.
- Foul or profane language at any time will not be tolerated.
- No moving about in the courtroom, the only time movement is allowed is when you have been called to the bench for your case and when you are dismissed by the court.
- In the event court takes a recess you may leave the court room but you will have to re-enter the courtroom via the main entrance.
- No loitering in any hallways.
- No food, drink, chewing gum, or tobacco products allowed in the court house.
- When speaking to the judge, person(s) are not allowed to lean on the bench.
- Proper dress code must be adhered to, for example:
 - No exposed midriffs or suggestive clothing;
 - No tank tops or halter style garments;
 - No excessively low rise jeans, pants, skirts, or shorts;
 - No exposed undergarments;
 - No garments with offensive slogans or advertising alcohol or drugs
